

And no Corn or Tobacco so attached or seized may after that time be lawfully disposed of or applied to any other Use without the Consent of the Court or party or parties Interested upon pain of recompencing to the party or Parties grieved double the Value of the Tobacco or Corn so unlawfully disposed of or applied to be incurred by all or any party or parties concerning to such unlawful disposition after knowledge or warning or sufficient means used whereby they might or should take notice that it was so attached or seized and the Tobacco so unlawfully disposed of if there were found within the Province shall be restored to the use of the willer.

And if there be more wills then one laid upon any Corn or Tobacco in manner foresaid such Tobacco and Corn shall stand bound in like manner as afore to the use of any will according to the Order they were laid upon it except that where there be two or more Executions of one date laid upon a crop or house of Tobacco or Corn the execution shall be levied by equal partition among the Parties interested in such Executions.

Provided always that so much as shall be mentioned upon any will to be for Customs or Subsidies to the use of the Lord Proprietary Granted by Assembly or for the more and proper debts of the Lord Proprietary otherwise paying them by fine forfeiture or a signment make fidei or for publick Services to the use or account of the Province allowed or Authoured by act or house of Assembly or for fees of publick Officers published by the Lew General and Council in a table for that purpose Bearing date the first of August last / or for Landlords
