24 An Act for an Expedition
against the Indians

It shall be lawful to the Lieut General or other Captains by or under his authority to make an expedition against the Susquehannahs or other Indians who have committed the late Outrages upon the English at such time and in such manner as he or they shall think fit and to take out of every County or hundred within the Province the third man able to bear arms such as he or they shall think fit to go upon the said Expedition except that the Lieutenant General and his apprentices are not to be reckoned in any hundred to any purpose of this Act

Every of which said men so leviable upon every hundred shall be at the charge of the hundred furnished and Provided with one fixed Gun two Pound of Powder and eight pound of Pistoll or bullet shot one sword and two months provision of vittuals & shall be transported to and from the Expedition with begets and all necessaries at the like charge of the hundred
