Whereas at the last meeting of the Governour and the Freemen of the County of Saint Maryson the 7th of this instant month the Assembly was adjourned until the 7th of February next by reason there was then no Return made from the Isle of Kent but since the Inhabitants of the said Island being come so long delay may prove much disadvantageous to the whole Country These are in his Lordships name to will and require you forthwith upon sight hereof to give Notice to all the Inhabitants of Saint Marys County that intend to anticipate the aforesaid adjournment to the 17th of this instant month and that I do expect either their personal appearance by Proxy or delegates to attend the Governour and Council at Saint Maryson the 17th day aforesaid there to advise and Consult upon the important Affairs of this Province

Monday the 17 January

By reason that Mr Breton who was appointed Clerk of this present Assembly did not appear nor notice from the Governour adjourned the house till tomorrow 9 Clock

Tuesday 18th January

Upon non appearance of Mr Breton as aforesaid the Governour adjourned the house till Thursday next
