The freemen of that part of this Province of Maryland  
 now called Providence being by my Appointment duly sum-  
 moned to this present Assembly did unanimously make  
 Choice of W<sup>r</sup> Puddington and W<sup>r</sup> James Cox for their Burges-  
 ses I being therein Person at that time
