Was read Declaration upon the Act providing for Soldiers
pay and Declaration upon the Act for Estates
& approved by both Houses

Both Houses declare that no further Secrecy is
Required mentioned in the Oath (after this present day
of Sessions) taken for that Purpose neither do they find
it any wise requisite

Upon motion of Adjourning the house of Assembly
It was alledged that all Persons bound to attend the Assem-
bly ought to be protected from arrests

Whereupon the Bungees desire no Protection at
all for being Bungees but declare the contrary and desire
to be liable to all Suits actions and arrests

And the Governor adjourned both Houses till
the tenth day of January next unless upon urgent occasion
as the Governor shall see cause Proclamation shall issue forth
anticipating the said Adjournment
