The said house being called the Governor Captain Price Mr. Secretary and Captain Vaughan assembled and the Burgesses of the lower house being sent for came and Joyne'd themselves with the upper house this day for the more Convenience and speedier dispatch of all Business and in the first Place the Bills and Orders before mentioned were all read and Voted as is before expressed

Afterwards it was put to the vote of both Houses whether in regard of the long Experience of time elapsed they did Agree that all Bills Acts and Orders as well such as have often been read and Voted to Enguement as all the rest that have been read and Assented unto by both Houses shall pass for Laws and Orders of the Province and stand good to all intents and Purposes without further reading though they have not been so often read and Voted as was directed by the Order of the house for that Purpose Ye or No
