

with Indentures whether by Indenture or Purchase shall within the aforesaid time bring or Cause to be brought such Servant with his Indenture into the said Court before a Justice who shall Certify the same to the next Court & there Record the said Indentures with the knowledge of the Serv<sup>t</sup> and the Clerk shall have the like fees formerly to be paid by the Master of the said Servant.

That all Servants at the expiration of their several times of Service if there be no other Agreement besides their Old Clothes shall be allowed One Altir Suit one Pair of Canvas Drawers one pair of Shoes and Stockings one new hat or Cap if he hath not one and three Barrels of Corn and if there be any Agreement to the contrary hereof the Allowance shall be according to the Bargain and Contract made between the Master or Owner and the Servant and if the Servant or Servants shall be Assigned over or hired to any person or Persons whatsoever he or they with whom such Servant or Servants shall serve to the expiration of his or their time of Service shall by Virtue hereof be Compelled to pay and satisfy his or her the said Servant or Servants several dues by Indenture or otherwise.

It is Ordered by this present General Assembly that Mr Richard Preston Mr William Parker Mr John Lawson Mr John Hatch Mr Sampson Waringe Mr Cuthbert Penwick Mr John Wade Mr Arthur Turner Mr William Parrott or any six of them are Authorised by Virtue hereof to Treat with the Indians Emperor as in their discretion they shall think fit Concerning the former Articles Concluded with him or to make others if need shall require and
