

past under the Great Seals, thence, into them respec-
 tively within the time limited by the said last
 Condition of Plantation, and not otherwise.
 And in compliance with a request in a letter
 which was lately received from the Mayor
 of the Upper and Lower House of our General
 Assembly held there in April last We do hereby
 Ratify and Confirm such Sale and Dispo-
 sition of our Stock of Beasts Cattle and personal
 Estate there as was made thereof from and after
 the Death of our late Dear brother of Noble
 memory Leonard Calvert Esquire until the
 One and Twentieth of April one thousand six
 hundred forty Nynne, Excepting our Ordnance
 and all such other things of ours as did at that
 time (viz on the one and twentieth of April
 aforesaid) remain in the hands of Mrs Mary
 Wort Esquire undisposed of, or that were or have
 at any other time before or since been sold or
 disposed of by her to her brother Mr Giles Brent
 or to her Sister Mrs Mary Wort or to any other
 person or persons in trust for them, or any of them.
 Provided always that in Lease of our said Stock
 and personal Estate the Cattle vendible
 be raised for our use, viz Six hundred Cows and
 a Bull, by an Act passed in the Olfth of the
 Saint Marys on the said one and twentieth
 of April one thousand six hundred forty
 and intituled An Act for the support of the
 Lord Proprietary be accordingly provided &
 raised for us as aforesaid by an assignment of
 the then Inhabitants of the said province and de-
 livered to the commissioners of our Treasury the
 for our use, as on before April 1651 and not other-
 wise. In all which We doubt not but all the
 there with & especially for how great a desire we have
 to comply with them in any thing We can,
 thought with much regard to our selfe, and
 willing we are soon to departe from our selfe
 for their good. And whereas We are informed that
 the said Thomas Greene abovementioned did
 make use of his knowledge of being a counsellor
 there to prohibit him from paying his Debts
 thereby abusing so our Great Dishonour and
 authority there, which was done from our viceroy

that
