

that any of our Council should doe, nor imagine  
that any whom we should honour with so great  
dignity, and trust would be so unworthy as to  
make any such use thereof. Wee doe therefore  
heroby Declare for prevention of the like in our  
 Colonies hereafter, That hee who or our Councill  
shall signify our or their pleasures to the contrary,  
every one of our Councill or other Officers there  
shall be liable to be proceeded against legally for  
any Debt hee shall paye, fine or imprisonment  
in the same manner, mutatis mutandis, as  
any of the Councill or the like officers in Vir-  
ginia respectively have bene usually & legally  
for seven yeeres last past in the like cases proceed-  
ed against in that Colony of Virginia, And this  
wee suppose will be as well a sufficient protection  
against the prevention of oppression or injustice  
thereby any of our Councill or other officers  
shall doe; as for the due Execution of Justice upon  
all such and every of them upon all occasions,  
Wee have further assigned to the better to of above men-  
tioned in the said Major part of the Upper and  
Lower House of our said Generall Assembly held  
there in April last, Wee say that Wee have caused  
of those laws, which wee had notice of now passed in  
the said Assembly, and also of those passed in the Assem-  
bly held at Saint Maryes in April one thousand  
six hundred forty Nynne above mentioned to be brought  
together in parchment, and to be sent herewith  
thero, with our Officers unto them in an Instru-  
ment in writing under our hand and greater Seal  
And wee therovnto annexed as appeared therovnto  
appeared, and wherovnto for more certainty, we  
have annexed, wherovnto wee have also given  
power to our Lieutenant there for the tyme being  
the Enacting and repealing of temporary laws for  
farre as Wee thought reasonable and sufficient for  
the satisfaction of the people there, and in complian-  
ce with a desire in the said letter to that purpose  
for any other thing contained in the said Letter Wee  
referre the Assembly there to your our said Lieutenant  
William Stone for answer therovnto according to our  
Instructions sent herewith to you and our Councill  
there; Wee are sorry to understand that John Jarbo  
one vnto whom Wee wish'd well, hath behav'd his  
selfe so unmanerly and contumaciously towards  
you our said Lieutenant William Stone as app-
