

otherwise good satisfied. That then such
Offender or Offenders shall be publicly whipt
and be imprisoned during the pleasure of
the Lord Proprietary, or the Lieutenant or
Chief Governor of this Province for the tyme
being. And that every such offender and
offenders for every second offence shall forfeit
ten pounds sterling or the value thereof to
be levied as aforesaid, or in case such offender
or offenders shall not then have goods and
chattels within this Province sufficient for
that purpose, then to be publicly and severely
whipt and imprisoned as before is expressed.
And that every person or persons before men-
tioned offending herein the third tyme shall
for such third offence forfeit all his lands and
goods, and be forever banished and expelled
out of this Province. And Be it also further
Enacted by the same authority aforesaid and
assent, That whatsoever person or persons
shall from hence forth upon any occasion of
offence or otherwise in a reprochfull manner
or way declare call or denominate any person
or persons whatsoever in habiting, residing,
trafficking trading or sojourning within
this Province, or within any the Ports, Harbors
Protes, or Havens to the same belonging. Or
Heretick, Schismatick, Idolater, Puritan, Independ-
dant, Presbyterian, Popish Priest, Jesuit, Jesuited
Papist, Lutheran, Calvinist, Anabaptist, Brownist
Antinomian, Barrenist, Roundhead Separatist, or
other name or terme in a reprochfull manner
relating to matters of Religion, shall for every such
offence forfeit, and lose the summe of ten shillings
sterling, or the value thereof to be levied on the
goods and chattels of every such offender and of-
fenders, the one halfe thereof to be forfeited
and paid unto the person or persons of whom
such reprochfull words are or shall be spoken or
uttered, And the other halfe thereof to the Lord Pro-
prietary and his heires Lords and Proprieta-
ries of this Province. But if such person or
persons who shall at any tyme utter or speak
any such reprochfull words or language, shall
