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Dissention and unhappie Wars, But now in
estimable doe the blessings thereof by proved on
this Province in planting Christianity among
a People that knewe not God, nor had heard
Christ. All which as wee Recognize & Acknowledge
to be done and performed (wee under God) by your
Lords Industry, and pious intentions towards the
advancement and propagation of Christian
Religion and the Peace and Happiness of this
Colony and Province. Soe wee doubt not but our
posterity will remember the same with a
fidelity to the honor of your Lord and your Heires
For Ever, Wee contemplate whereof, Wee hum-
bly beseech your Lord that as a Memoriall to all
Posterities, among the Records of the Court of
Great Assembly within this Province for ever to
endure of our thankfulness, fidelity & obedience
It may be published and declared by your Lord
and the present Assembly, And Enacted by
authority of the same. That Wee being bound
therunto by the Lawes both of God, and Man. Doe
Recognize and acknowledge your Lords just Right
and Righte to this Province by the Grant & Donation
of the late King Charles of England, Under the
Great Seale of England, bearing date at Westminster
the twentieth of June in the Eight year of his Reign
Anno Domini 1632. And Doe also Recognize and
acknowledge your Lord to be the true and absolute
Lord and Proprietary of this Province. And Doe humbly
submit unto all power, Jurisdiction and authority
granted, and conferred unto your Lord & your Heires
in and by the said Grant and Donation. And
Doe hereby submit and oblige our Heires &
posterity for Ever untill the last drop of our
blood be spent to maintain, uphold, and
defend your Lord and your Heires Lords and
Proprietaries of this Province in all the Royall
Rights, Jurisdictional authorities and preeminences
soe given granted, and conferred unto your Lord by
the said Grant, and donation, soe far as
not in any sort infringe or prejudice the just
and lawfull liberties or priviledges of the free borne
Subjects of the Kingdom of England. And wee
humbly beseech your Lord to accept the same as the
first writer in this Assembly of our selfe.
