

their Great Seals of this Province and for the buying
being shalbe void and null, and it shalbe law-
full for the ^{said} Lord Proprietary and his heirs to enter
upon lands, profits, and dispose of any such lands
or tenements soe from bym to bym purchased
or acquired from any Indian or other as aforesaid,
at his or their Will and pleasure. Whosoever
person or persons doe purchasing or acquiring
as aforesaid have some lawfull right by the
the said lands or tenements soe purchased or
acquired at the time of such purchase or acqui-
sition, by some Grant under the Great Seal
of the said Province from his said Lord or his he-
irs Lord and Proprietary of the same.

Articles of Oblivion.

4.

The Lord Proprietary is willing that it should
be Enacted. And Be it Enacted by the said Lord
Proprietary with the Consent of the Honorable
Council of this Province that there shalbe
an utter abolition of all Actions touching tow-
ers damage for any fault Committed against
any one in his Majesty's service, by any of the party
who were in Rebellion against his Majesty's Govern-
ment here at any time betwixt the 15th
February 1644. And the 5th of August 1646.
(Excepting Richard Ingle and John Purford
Marriner, and such others of the Province of Kent
as were not pardoned by his Majesty's brother
Leonard Calvert Esq^r Governor, his Majesty's Lieut-
enant of this Province. And likewise of
all Actions touching to restore prizes for any
goods or labours employed during the said time
for the defence of the Country. And Be it
further Enacted by the authority and Consent
aforesaid that all Contracts made with the
said Party, then in Rebellion against the
Government or any person of that party to
the use maintenance or behoofe of the said Province
shalbe actionable in any Court of his Majesty's
then whom the said Province was party) the
matter whereof was any plundered goods or falls
shalbe void in law, and all such persons as hath bene
recovered for any of them by the wrongfull prof-
