

Inhabitants of this Province shall be permitted
upon any bargain whatsoever to trade with
any Indian, or Indian in or through any
part of this Province without special license
to be given by the Governor for the sum
of five shillings to the Lord Proprietary of this Province, or
his heirs, under his or their hand and Seal
at Arms or his Lieutenant or Chief
Governor of this Province for the year being
under the Great Seal of this Province made
by authority upon pain of confiscation to
the Lord Proprietary and his heirs of all
goods and commodities carried and attempted
to be sold, or which shall be purchased or acquired
in or by any such trade or commerce, or in
case they cannot be seized in specie, then the
value thereof when any such offence against
this Act and the true intent and meaning of
this Act shall be discovered, and
whom they, their or persons for offending, or
any of his, her, or their money, goods or chattels
shall be apprehended, or seized on in any part
of this Province.

An Act for the Support of the Lord Proprietary.

To the End his Majesty the better to provide
our good wills and intentions in complying with
his Majesty's laws, for as our poor and late distressed
condition can well beare, and is yet capable of
And to the End also he may be the better en-
couraged, and enabled to protect us, in our laws,
liberties and Estates. Be it Enacted by the Lord
Proprietary with the advice and consent of the
Upper and lower House of this present Assembly
That all Tobacco shipped upon any Dutch vessel
and bound for any other port than such as belong
to the Commonwealth of England shall pay for
Custom to the Lord Proprietary of this Province, or
his heirs for these seven years ensuing seven
shillings in money for every Hoghead
quantity of an Hoghead shipped, to be transported
