

That no person whatsoever within
 this Province shall by any colour or sug-
 gestion be disarm'd or dispoyled in his Arms
 or Ammunition (and thereby consequently
 left to the cruelty of the Indians) unless such
 person be proved to bear Arms to an hostile
 intent, or contrary to the usual and allow'd
 Customs of the Country for such man's
 defence.

This Present Generall Assembly having
 Consider'd the Present State of the Province
 and finding the Agreement according
 to the said Articles, greatly conducing to
 the Honour of the Lord Baltimore, and the
 peace of the Province, as also tending to the
 remoordall of those feares and follouts too
 frequently known amongst us, and great
 furthering the uniting of the whole In-
 habitants and bringing them to a better
 Caparity against the Invasions of the
 Indian Enemy whom we have obser-
 ved to take advantage of our former distra-
 ction and therefore Enacted by the Lord Prop-
 rietary of this Province, by and with the Con-
 sent of this Generall Assembly, that the said
 Articles be to all intents and purposes
 violably observ'd and confirm'd
