

An Act concerning a Register of Births, Marriages and Burials

Be it Enacted by the Lord Proprietary by and with the Consent of this present Generall Assembly That the Names of all that shall be borne, Married, or buried within this Province shall be exhibited to the Search of Every respective County Court who shall keep a just Register thereof, who shall be allowed five pounds of Tobacco as a fee due unto him for Every such Register made and kept And every person infringing the said Lawe for the space of two months after such Birth Marriage or Buriall, Each Person soe infringing shall forfeit twenty Pound of Tobacco to the said Clarke This Act to continue for three yeeres or to the End of the next Generall Assembly, and no longer.
