Indians and fairely increased by the
Assesment of the lower house to the said Act.

Whereupon it was ordered to be read in the
House and upon reading ordered to pass without
contradiction. Whereupon the Governor gave his
Assent in the name of his Majesty in these words: (his
Majesty will eth that this be a Law)
