house with an Intimation that if they desired a con-  
firmation with the Upper house they were ready to  
accept of one.

Then was also sent a Draught of an Act for the  
right and Privilege of Peers, which was also re-  
ferred to the lower house for their consideration.

Then came three members of the lower house and  
desired two Members of the Upper house to be joined  
with them to draw up the Act touching the  
Treasurers at Law and Escheators, which upon it was  
ordered that Mr. Courcy and Mr. Lloyd should be joined  
with them as aforesaid.

Then was read the Act for retention of officers, which  
was sent up from the lower house with their Assent  
unto it subscribed by their Clerks.

The house adjourned until to morrow  
morning nine of the Clock.
