Then was read the Act for Conveyance of all
Letters concerning the State and publick affairs

Which was voted unanimously to pass

Then was Read the Act prohibiting Trade with
Indians for Goods or Wares

Voted by the house an unecessary Act.

Then was Read an Order concerning the drawing
of all the Acts in force in this Province for every
Respective County Court

Voted that the transcribing of the said Lawd's now
upon Record is a prerogative due unto the Secretary
and cannot be granted from him;

The Act for Repeal of the Act for Customs
having under passed this house as it is now presented
presented & required a further time of consideration
therefore is referred till to morrow morning

The Upper house adjourned till mid of the
next in the morning

Wednesday the first of May

As was yesterday

Then was read an Act for the Repeal of the Act
for Customs and another Act for the Support
of the Government which was voted by the whole
house to pass.

The Judgment of the Lower house upon Hugh
Lloyd's petition being sent to the Upper house is
referred till the next Conference

Upon the reading of a Bill presented by the Lower
house concerning magistrates and for ministers
it was voted to be altogether insufficient and so
