

eight hundred, with one hundred pounds for a Captain and
 a Surgeon and for the pay of the officers and
 Soldiers, aforesaid to be proportioned as follows, &
 until the Soldier's returned to his fort and
 in the interim, hundred pounds of tobacco in passage
 mouth for the Interpreter six hundred pounds
 to the Lieutenant four hundred pounds &
 the Sergeant three hundred pounds and to the
 Surgeon four hundred pounds and to every
 private Soldier two hundred and fifty pounds
 And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid
 that for the defraining of the Charge of the said war
 and all charges incident to it, That the good men and
 honest and hardy men be so ready by ways of ship
 and so according to the usual Custom of the
 Province and in the usual call of service, to say
 what follows, that in their discretion shall be admiss-
 ary against the Indians or Massoud Indians or any
 other Indians that shall be found to have killed any of
 the inhabitants of the Province or shall
 disturb the peace thereof and the Charge to be defrained
 do as aforesaid, this Act to continue and be in force
 for two years or the next General Assembly where
 shall first happen
