went three, with one Interpreter a Captain and
 a Chirurgon And for the pay of the officers and
 Souldiers aforesaid to be proportioned as followeth
 untill the Souldiers returned to the Countrey
 in the first six hundred pounde of tobacco in the
 month for the Interpreter six hundred pounde
 to the Lieutenant four hundred pounde to
 the Sergeant three hundred pounde and to every
 Chirurgon four hundred pounde and to every
 private Souldier two hundred and fifty pounde
 And so it further enacted by the authority aforesaid
 that for the defraying of the Charge of the said warre
 and all charges incident to it That the Governour and
 Councill are hereby impowred to levy by way of Asses-
 ment of pole according to the usuall Custom of this
 Province And in the future all of the said Asses-
 ment what so ever they in their discretion shall thinke
 necessary against the Spaniards or Maynour Indians or any
 of the Indians that shall be found to have killed any of
 the Inhabitants of this Province or that have or shall
 disturb the peace thereof And the Charge to be defrayed
 as aforesaid this Act to continue and be in force
 for two yeares or the next Generall Assembly which
 shall first happen

An Act for Encouragement of our Souldiers as shall
 adventure in the defence of the Countrey

Be it Enacted by the Lord Proprietary by and with the
 consent of the upper and lower houses of this present
 generall Assembly that every person that shall adventure
 as a Souldier in any warre in the defence of this Countrey
 and shall therein happen to be maimed or wounded
 shall according to his place and Quality receive mainte-
 nance from the Countrey according to his disability
 how many times himselfe
