I shall forfeit to the Lord Proprietary and his heirs one thousand pounds of tasted tobacco or the value thereof to be levied upon his goods and chattels And if any person for offending shall not have goods and chattels sufficient within this Province to satisfy the aforesaid penalty or that the same be not speedily satisfied then shall the person for offending suffer imprisonment for two months without Bayle or Mayne price

And be it further Enacted by the authority aforesaid that whosoever shall be Sumoned by writt out of any Courts of Justice of this Province to swear as Juror in any tryall in any Court within this Province and shall refuse to swear in any case depending whether Criminal or Civil not being by any other office (excepted) and there to lawfully required shall forfeit to the Lord Proprietary and his heirs five hundred pounds of tasted tobacco or the value thereof to be levied upon his goods and chattels And if any person for offending shall not have goods and chattels within this Province to satisfy the aforesaid penalty or that the same be not speedily satisfied then shall the person for offending suffer two months imprisonment without Bayle or Mayne price

And be it further Enacted by the authority aforesaid that whosoever being by writt lawfully Sumoned and there required to swear as Witness in this Province and shall refuse to testify upon oath in any case depending either Criminal or Civil shall forfeit to the Lord Proprietary five hundred pounds of tobacco to be levied upon his goods and chattels And if any person for offending shall not have goods and chattels within this Province sufficient to satisfy the aforesaid penalty or that the same be not speedily satisfied then shall the person for offending suffer two months imprisonment without Bayle or Mayne price

Provided that this Acte nor any thing therein contained shall not extend nor be interpreted to extend to the jurisdiction of any of the Lords of Mannors within this Province in their priviledges of appointing Constables within their respective Mannors

And be it further Enacted that every County Court be
