

Summons' wife and good for void able finge Gunn and
 powder according to his Summons and orders or shall
 refuse to answer Exports or Exports at the command of
 the said Officers shall yearely forfeit for every such
 offence committed fifty pounds of tobacco the one moiety
 to the Lord Proprietary and the other moiety to the
 use of the Company unless he show good cause why he did
 not appear as aforesaid to be allowed by the Officers
 commanding in the said Company And be it further
 Enacted by the authority and consent aforesaid that the
 Sheriffs be by Warrant under the hand of the Gov. or
 Lieutenant Gov. Major or Captains, or any other Officer
 commanding in sure trayned Bands sufficiently authorized
 to levy the fine aforesaid upon any the Goods or
 Chattels of any of the persons so offending as aforesaid
 And if any person or persons shall be obstinate and malicious
 refuse to Exports' master or Trayned as aforesaid And shall
 be thereof convicted by two sufficient Witnesses before the
 Governour and Council or any Courts of Record after the term
 time in any one yeare being called thereto shall be fined for
 hundred pounds of Casted tobacco the one halfe to the Lord
 Proprietary and the other halfe to the Company to be
 paid as aforesaid And if in case any sure person as aforesaid
 shall not have Goods nor Chattels to satisfy the said fine
 of five hundred pounds of Casted tobacco shall suffer his
 word the Supervisor without Bayle or Magna pennis. And
 in case any of the aforesaid Officers shall happen to die by
 any Servant in the Province and that their Master or S.
 shall refuse to let such Servant for a while yet to serve
 or place for appointed by the respective Officers for tray-
 ning or shall refuse to furnish such Servant or Servants
 with sufficient Gunne and Ammunition shall be liable to
 fine of five or more as the aforesaid respective Officers
 ought according to the Order from time to time to lay upon
 any freeman committing the like offence the Order to extend
 for three yeares or to the end of the next bond case After
