An Act for Support of Government

It is the End that the Inhabitants of this Province  
may not be wanting to our selves who are to enjoy  
the fruits of peace procured by a certain and settled Govern-  
ment and that we may as far as our Condition will  
pardon our knowledge our thankfullness to the Lord  
Proprietary of this Province for his care and good will  
towards us our just rights (by raising a Support to the  
Government. Be it Enacted by the authority and Consensus  
of this present General Assembly that no person shall  
hinder or molest any Indians of this Province or good friends  
any Goods of this Province to trade with any Indians  
the Northward of this Province without license of his  
Majesty of his Governour for the tyme being upon paine  
of forfeiture to his said Majesty of all Commodities unlawfully  
had for and of all vessels and trucks unlawfully had  
to the contrary hereof And that every taxable person  
within this Province shall pay yearly two hundred  
of Casted tobacco pipes to his Majesty and his heirs  
and Proprietary of this Province for to be employed
