the advice and consent of the upper and lower houses
of this present Generall Assembly that the Taxe of Eight
hundred pounds of tobacco raised the last yeare be this yeare
paid where it was not paid the last yeare And the
Colonell Nathaniel Byrd M^r Thomas Howard M^r
Byrd the Boate and men that carryed Captaine Byrd
and M^r Bateman up the Baye and set of her just
at the Governour and Councils shall approve of and
approve to be paid out of the said Taxe The Remain
of the said Taxe to be to the present Governour toward
the defraying the Charge in providing the Army
and paying the Guard of Soldiers

An Act for the duties and Masters of Ships
Be it Enacted by the Lord Proprietary with the Assent
of the upper and lower houses of this present Generall Assembly
that all Vessells what so ever not properly belonging to
this
