WHEREAS That perfidious and prejudiced fellow —
Goddall whom wee lately intrusted to bedur —
Lieutenant of Maryland to th' late Sir Theomo' and an-
other Digno' and contrary to his oaths and truste to
inve the sayngs he had to sayng with him in raysing a
Sediton and facton against our Jurisdiction and right
of Government th'ire made a Sinfonie as weare
credibly informed of a passing of our letter to him of the
seabutante November One thousand Six hundred fifty
Nine for proceeding an Acte of Assembly in Maryland
for a custome of two shillings for every hogshead of tobacco
exported from thence to any Porte of Greate Bri:
or Irelan'd and of four shillings for every hogshead
shipped to any other Porte. And possid the people of th'
with apprehension, as if he had orders from us, whi
he never had that in case such a lawe did not passe
putt in present Execution the Acte for Custome in
January One thousand Six hundred forty Six for
paymunt of four shillings per hds for all tobacco ex-
out of that Province. We thought fitt hereby to declare
to them what our Proceedings haue truly bee[n] &
what our intentions and desires are in that matter
(viz) Considering of some Complaints against that Law
for Custome made in the yeare 1646. as if it had been
Exported by force or fear from the Assembly there of
which we verthoo' we are satisfied by somesight having
that word then passe[n]. it was not, and that it was
as too burthenous to the poore to have and a greate
discouragement to Exports if that Lawe should in that
particular
