 it was in compar^{is}on to the tax^{es} which were granted in
 Virginia for that and now am good but be still con-
 sider^{ing} that all those who understand any thing of the
 nature of Government and of the necessity to support
 it for the people to benefit and protection and that have
 any good opinion for us and our Right there will thinke
 it reasonable to settle some considerable Revenue in
 the waye of Customs or otherwise for the supports of
 the Government and publick use there in the said man-
 ner as their Neighboures and all other Colonies doe
 to knowe to the world that we desired no more
 doe hereby authorize and require our deare Brother
 Philip Calvert Esq. our Govern^{or} of the said Province
 in our name with the Consent of the next yeare all
 Assembly there to repeal the said Acte for Customs
 made in the yeare 1640 upon condition that another
 Acte in that kind should be passed at the same time by the
 said Assembly and assented to in our name by our said
 deare Count, who by word and our letters and our
 their Govern^{or} or other officers therefor the bymes
 whoe shall be from time to time authorized by us
 that purpose may be impowred to travel upon the
 from time to time inhabiting or being in and trading
 Maryland for the supports of the Government and
 also the said Customes Taxes and duties persons
 in and not more as at the same time are or shall be
