Humble Servt

*That whereas at a Primitall Court held at St. George do the 3d
October 1648 m^r William Eston heade Esq; in unto petition
was presented by one witness Mr John Anderson wherein it
was proved that he left all his Landes &c to his wife Dyp
sing for the good of her and her children, and desiring her to
alleviate unto Robert Fenwick and Richard Fenwick some part
of the Land according to her discretion or and which eas at the
said Court was declared after the hearing of cause of the said
William Eston heade are for ever barred all Payment of
any hire to the said William. Upon petitioners humble
to assigne farrs following whereupon in the said order humbly
referring the same to this Assembly to determine finally
thereof*

*Y^e petitioners humblye conuict the cause to be that land
cannot be aliened but under hands and seals:*

*2^d That if a Soldier make a mutiny will goe post him
conuict the cause to be he can only suee dispossess of his
personall estate, and cannot disinherit an heir at law
by such will especially being attested by one Will

can only suee the wife being of sound minde etc*
