

In two hundred after the reading of the Lawes  
 passed in this Parliament that all publick moneys  
 by this Act to be levied shall be assessed by the  
 Governour and Councill, as alsoe the publick charge  
 of three thousand pounds of tobacco brought into  
 the lower house this day for publick expences whiche  
 being added to the Treasurer by order from the  
 Parliament he moreth declared that the house was  
 dissolved:
