

To the Honourable Proprietaries  
of New-Carolina.

It is Quashed by the said Proprietary by and with the  
consent of the Upper and Lower houses of this General  
Assembly, That all persons who shall desire marriage  
have liberty to apply to him or his substitutes a Minister or  
Pastor or Magistrate for the contracting thereof, And  
be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that all  
persons within this Province intending marriage shall make  
publication thereof either at the Church or Chapel or  
at least in one of the County Court or Meeting house.  
And that at such time as such church or Chapel  
or Meeting house be full and least by reasonable  
cause cognizance thereof, And that it shall and may be  
lawfull upon Certificate had from the Minister Pastor  
or Clerk of such where such Publication shall have been  
made threemonths after the said Publication for any  
Minister Pastor or Magistrate to joyn in marriage such  
persons as aforesaid, And if any person shall presume to  
contract Marriage without such Publication to be made and  
Certificate had as aforesaid or without particular fitting  
from the said General Assembly or the said Governor of this  
Province or privately within the bounds of this Province  
Contract marriage Godly persons so contracted or married  
shall be liable to a fine of one thousand pounds of tobacco  
And every such Pastor Magistrate or Minister joyning in  
marriage any person without first such publication or any  
ways abusing this Rule shall be liable to a fine of  
thousand pounds of tobacco for one half year and  
to the said Proprietary for other halfe to be for merte  
be recovered by action of debt or information wherein  
no wages or leave of pay or proportion to be allowed  
admitt.

And be it further enacted that all Contracts or  
promises of marriage not made before some Minister  
Pastor or Magistrate with two sufficient witnesses  
be and are hereby declared null and void. This Day  
the Thirteenth for the year of our Lord one thousand  
General Assembly.
