An Acte concerning  
for money and Bullion  
brought into this Province

Whereas it appears that the Importation of money  
and Bullion into this Province is of great Consequence  
for the Good of these Inhabitants how in several  
respects for the better settling and procurator thereof  
Be it Enacted by the said Proprietary by and with  
the Assent and approbation of the Upper and Lower  
houses of this present Generall Assembly that after  
provision made for the same in this Province every  
Householder and Tradesman in the Province shall take  
up ten shillings of specie of money current in this  
Province according to the Acte for that behalf made  
Every person under his or their charge or custody to be  
paid for in good refined tobacco at 2. s. for the said  
householders and Tradesmen as aforesaid are hereby  
obliged and Enacted to pay to said tobacco a proportion  
of the said specie of money proportionably for every  
person respectively in this Acte to endure for three  
years or to the end of the next Generall Assembly.

An Acte for Encouraging  
sowing English Graine

Whereas it appears that the sowing of English  
Graine will be much to the public Good of  
Inhabitants of this Province and for the better encourage  
therein Be it Enacted by the said Proprietary with  
the Assent of this present Generall Assembly that what  
here growing shall paye and be taken at five shillings  
the Bushell Barley and English pease at three  
shillings the Bushell Rye at four shillings the best  
and best at two shillings six pence the Rye
