 County vizt Col Nathaniel By Capt  
 Thomas Donnell and M<sup>r</sup> Francis Wright  
 whom this house thinke fit persons  
 for that employment if the Governour  
 Council shall appoynt any of  
 them in the name of the Governour and  
 Council to treat with the Sasquesanough  
 Indians as often as need shall require  
 and to sign by the Governour  
 as occasion shall be needfull, & if persons  
 together and write presents at their own  
 charge and direction, And if they agree  
 therof shall be bound to what is here  
 proposed what they would please to draw  
 up an act to that purpose.

Upon the Consideration of the answer of the  
 Lower house to the paper sent yesterday  
 from this house touching the performance  
 of the Articles to the Sasquesanough  
 Indians

- 1 This house doth conceive that since they do  
 not intend to give the Governour power to  
 send for ten men in their paper mentioned  
 they need not at all provide for or at  
 least not sufficiently provide for the perform-  
 -ance of the Articles aforesaid since it is not  
 in his power to provide and ordaine but  
 the will of persons to be employed
- 2 The Jurisdiction of this house being only to  
 move the Lower house to the furnishing the  
 necessary manner of the Articles with the
