 ordinary, which promise considered you shall
 humbly request him to be upon your honors for
 such benefits as to your honors may seem meet
 that his publick design may be encouraged
 to not languish.

And he shall pray
 your reading of which your honors do
 know that your honors may have a lease for
 three acres of the Country's land for 31 years
 so much of his Executors laid out in just parts
 as the Governor shall think fit of the rest
 of the part is unresolvable

The Lower house do consent that your honors
 may have three acres of the Country's land for
 one and thirty years to him and his Executors to
 be laid out by the Governor, provided that your
 Executors be obliged to build a new house
 thereon at his own charge and charge a lease owner
 there in for the Country's service, and if either
 of all persons what so ever attending the
 assembly or upon their other ordinary occasion
 it shall be by me. As to the rest of the
 your honors borrowed with the Upper house.
