

provided that all Debts already undertaken  
to be paid as an act of Contracted between  
the 24th of May 1667 or the 25th of May  
1668 where Debts are not to be had for  
the satisfying such Debts be discharged  
by Order, Rye, Garley, and Pease at last  
Ordered as in this not mentioned upon a  
lawfull tender of such grants made to  
Judith or his certain Attorney.

Then came a Member of the Lower house  
with this paper writ  
The honorable Doct. declares that he 3000 lb  
wishes the Lieutenant Generall make himself  
Debtor for to the publick Doct. till remain  
in his hands for his satisfaction for as he  
has paid 10000 lb out of his own pocket  
towards the advancement for victualling of  
Seas large officers. And Doct. pray that he would  
be pleased to accept thereof. And as for  
240 lb of powder now in the Lieutenant Generals  
hands, the Burgesses do pray that he  
would please to dispose thereof to the Militia  
of the frontiers Country to be imployed  
for the good of the publick in case of  
Invasion or Invasion of Indians.

Then came a Member from the Lower house  
with this petition following  
To the Rt honor. the Governour  
& Council of the honor. the  
Burgesses of this Colony  
The humble petition of the Inhabitants  
of Baltimore County  
That whereas there was a peace made with  
the Mattawock Indians a while past years  
since there have been two of those Indians  
killed for which they threaten a Revenge  
but have been kept from it as they say  
in hope of having satisfaction. And Doct.  
do pray that this honorable Assembly
