 power of all. Whereupon the Chancellor dema-  
 where the Lower house was sitting. To which  
 they answered in a house newly adjoining to the  
 house of Assembly. Whereupon by advice  
 of the house the Chancellor told them that  
 he could not own them to be the Lower house  
 of Assembly without they were sitting in the  
 usual place which was appointed by the Govern-  
 unless they had licence from him to adjourn  
 to some other place which as yet was not  
 to this house - Present the Govern.

When came two Members from the Lower  
 house of desired leave of the Govern. to  
 adjourn into another house which was granted
