

during which discourse between y^e Major and them came over Coll^o Washington, Coll^o Mason and Major Alderton and they likewise taxed them with the murders done on their side by them, but they made the same reply as to Major Truman that it was none of them. Then they made it appear y^e 3 of y^e said Susquehannough Indians were they that did y^e Murders on y^e other side.

On Monday Morning Early the Major commanded Mrⁿ Goods and two or three Ranks of men whereof himself was one to goe to the house of Mrⁿ Randolph Hanford to see if y^e Indians had plundered it, and if they found any Ammunition to bring it away w^t accordingly they did, and after returne back to y^e Forte y^e Defendant saw six Indians guarded with the Marylanders and Virginians and the Major with the Virginia officers sitting upon a tree some distance from them and after some while they all rose and came toward the Indians and caused them to be bound. And after some time they talked againe and the Virginia officers would have knocked them on the heads in y^e place presently, and particularly Coll^o Washington, said what should we keep them any longer let us knock them on the heads. we shall get the Forte to day, But y^e Defendant faith y^e the Major would not admitt of it but was over swayed by y^e Virginia officers, and after further discourse the said Indians were caused forth from the place where they were bound and they knocked them on the heads.

Coll^o Sam^t Collier and Coll^o Iesse Wharton came to desir the lower house to acquaint this house whether they have drawne up any thing by y^e way of Impeachment of Major Thomas Truman and if they would please to signifie to this house by a member of their house y^e same.
