the State house and prison at St. Maries and desirous to know what  
manner of windows this house will have for the prison.

This house upon debate thereof doe thinke fitt that y<sup>r</sup>. windows  
be of wood with substantiale iron barres and y<sup>r</sup>. f<sup>r</sup>. woods of the  
frames of y<sup>r</sup>. windows be layd in Oyle, also made soe large as to  
lie into y<sup>r</sup>. brick worke two foot and a half of a side both above  
and below y<sup>r</sup>. windows to be twenty inches wide and thirty inches  
high three Iron Barres upright and two or three of the upright Iron  
barres to be Inch and a quarter square and to be wrought into y<sup>r</sup>. two  
thwart Barres and that there be two windows below and one  
window of wood above, the Lower house desire the upper houses  
concurrance in this vote —
