This house cannot Concur in opinion with the Lower house (being unnecessary for Capt Allen to Range any longer, first because of peace with the Indians is not Ratified till the hostages are delivered. And therefore desire the Lower house better to consider whether it be not yet necessary Capt Allen to keep Ranging especially during the sitting of the Assembly.
