Major Thomas Truman having due Notice given him on the
Thursday last to prepare for his tryall this afternoon, being called
to make his appearance, and y^e Articles of Impeachment ag^t y^e
Said Major Thomas Truman being ready and after this the severall
Depositions annexed, thereto which alfoe were shewne to by the
severall and Respective Deponents in the presence and hearing of
the said Major Thomas Truman, Mr. Renelius Cheshedine his
Supt^r Attorney Gen^r M^r Robert Farreille Coll^r Wm Burges and Mr. Opp^r
Stephens according to a proceeding order of the Lower House did a
Manage y^e Said Impeachment and urge y^e severall Ordeneas ag^t
y^e Said Major Truman.

And y^e said Major Truman by M^r Benjamin Roderick his coun-
sell advised him, did confess the same and declared y^e said
Major did no way intend to stand to his justification
after which Confession and declaration the said Major by his Supt^r
Councell did humbly pray that this House would admitt of y^e
Reading of a certaine paper which y^e said Major said he hoped
would shew what Extenuate and Mitigate y^e Crimes before by
him confesed so that they should not appeare so griesous and
monstrous as in y^e Said Impeachment. They were held forth to be
and y^e said Major Truman by his said Councell was admitted
to make his defensee.

Whereupon and upon full Hearing on both Sides and after
Reading of the said Majors Commission and Instructions from his
Supt^r and Councell it was put to y^e Question whether Major
Thomas Truman be guilty of the Impeachment exhibited ag^t
him by the Lower House and voted - Nominis contadente
That the said Major Thomas Truman is guilty of the first
