per lb. and other port duties in pieces of eight at five Shillings & pieces of eight
and the other Monies a foot at 4th Rates a ft. it will much conduce to the
bringing in Money into this Province, and this Comitted being very sensible
of his Lordship's May Justaine by receiving his imposition and port duties
of 4th Monies a foot at 4th Rates. This Assembly may spare 7th of his
own way and means as they shall see most fitt and convenient.
