

A Member of this House may have Occasion to go a bout his necessary Occasions and Affairs in the Intervall of Assembly, and be absent from the sitting of Assembly, yet ought not for that Cause only to be removed from being a Member of Assembly, or to give and vote there when he comes in again.

Therefore this House have prepared a bill for the Electing and Summoning Messengers: Herewith sent and past this House to which they desire the Consent of His Lordship and upper House.

Then Came Col: Stevens from the upper House and Desire to know if the House have any business to Communicate to the upper House tonight if not they will adjourn.

Mr. Speaker answered that this House will send up a Message presently. Mr. Green sent to Call in the Committee, who came to the House. Then was read the Bill directing the Manner of Electing & Summoning Messengers, Delegates, &c: the third time of speciall Order and assented in these words to (viz)

October 4<sup>th</sup> 1683. Lower House of Assembly.

The Lower House have assented. . . . . House of Assembly  
The Clerk Comanded to sign . . . . . Message

The House, which was done accordingly  
Then Mr. John Rossby and Mr. William Hutchins were sent to the upper House with the Bill and Message and the Ordinance touching Electing and Summoning of Members of Assembly.

The Messengers returned and say they delivered the same to Col: Young in the upper House.

Resolved by this House that the Committee of Priviledges and Petitions prepare a bill prohibiting the Exportation of His Lordships Ordinance with a Clause for the repeal of an Act of the same title, and present the same to this House.

The House adjournes till to Morrow Morning 7 a Clock.

Saturday October 4<sup>th</sup> 1683.

The House called and all present as yesterday.

The House take into further debate the Matter Concerning Jacob Young referred by a Vote of this House yesterday till this Morning.

Whereupon Resolved that the following Message be sent to the upper House, (viz)

Lower House of Assembly October 4<sup>th</sup> 1683.

This House understanding that Jacob Young who was last Jefferions of Assembly impeached by this House is now brought up by the Sheriff of Maryland County in Order to receive his Tryall at the Barr of the upper House doth desire to know of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> of the upper House whether the Matter upon the sayd impeachment, be at such issue that he may receive his Tryall this
