Lower House of Assembly October 4th 1683.

This House desires the upper House to take Orders accordingly.
Mr^s Clement Hill and Doct^r Brooke sent to the upper House with a Report
and Message. They returne and say they have delivered a Report.

The Bill for advancement of Trade taken into consideration and Debate.

Then came Col^o Darnall from the upper House and presents
the following Message to Mr^s Speakers.

Upper House October 4th 1683.

This House understand from the Committee of the Lower House about
Jacob Young, that the said Committee finds Garatt (Banjoeringer) a
Material Evidence against the said Jacob Young, who being remote from
this place it is therefore Moved by this House, that the tryall of the said
Jacob Young be deferred till tomorrow Seven Night being the five tenth
of this present October and in the meantime the said Garatt, Banjoer-
inger may be served with the Sumon prepared for him already.

The House adjourned till to Morrow Morning Seven a Clock.

Tuesday October 7th 1683.

The House met and called, all present as yesterday.

Then was read what was done yesterday.

The Bill for the advancement of Trade taken into further Consideration
and put to the question whether a proviso for the better of St. Marys,
that the Charter shall not be prejudiced by the Act for advancement
of Trade shall be made to the said Bill, yea or Naye. Put in the Negative.

Resolved that only four Commissioners be appointed for every County
for the trial of said Counties, and ordered that the Members of this House
do nominate the said Commissioners for their respective Counties by
twelve a Clock today.
