 to this House a bill Entitled an Act for providing in Case of suddayne
 accidents in this Province: which was read of first time.

The Committee for Inspecting the Lawes, Report that they find in the body
 of the Lawes an Act for punishing certayne offences agt. of peace and
 Safety of this Province, which Law is not convenient to stand, by
 reason of the uncertayne Matter therein Conteyned.

Noted that a Bill be drawn by the Said Committee for of Security of
 His Lord's person, in more certayne termes, with a clause therein to
 repeal the former Act.
