

A Bill Entituled an Act for prohibiting His Lord's Ordinance &c. made of the second time and least to his government.

The Committee for the advancement of Trade come into this house; and bring with them the act Entituled an Act for advancement of Trade, amended in severall parts thereof. Since the second reading of the same.

These Amendments were read.

A Bill Entituled an Act for prohibiting His Lord's Ordinance &c mentioned to read the third time by Speciale order, and assented to by this House.

Mr Addam and Mr Weller sent to the upper house with of said bill.

The Committee for Consulting the bringing in of Money into this Province report, that they have prepared a Bill Entituled an Act for Advancement of Money. But the Members of the upper house joyned with them, have carried the same into the upper house for their perusal, who have promised to send it downe, when read there.

Voted that Mr Drullifead, bee requested by Mr Speaker to preach before y<sup>e</sup> Lower house of Assembly next Sabbath day.

Then came Capt Stevens and presents to this house, a Bill Entituled an Act for Naturalizing John Coines, Peter Mafise de Moyne and Andrew Mattson assented to by the upper house.

Then came Mr Robert Cavile from the Committee of Laws & Pleas to this house able Entituled an Act for providing in Case of Suddenay Accidents in this Province: which was read y<sup>e</sup> first time.

The Committee for Inspecting the Laws, Report that they find in the body of the Laws an Act for punishing Certayne offences ag<sup>t</sup> y<sup>e</sup> peace and Safety of this Province, which law is not convenient to stand, by reason of the uncertainayne Matter therein conteyned.

Voted that a Bill be drawn by the said Committee for y<sup>e</sup> Security of His Lord<sup>s</sup> person, in more certayne terms, with a clause therin to repeale the former act.

The said Committee goe upon the same.
