

to speake with Capt. Smith before they answer to y^e matter of places in Somerset Countye.

Proposed by a Member of this house whether any of y^e places appoynted for ports de: ought to be enabled to send Burgesses to y^e Assembly till there be a sufficient number of inhabitants to bear y^e charge of such their Burgesses and whether a clause ought not to be inserted into the bill for an Advancement of Trade to that purpose.

Voted that none of the places appoynted for ports de send Burgesses till y^e inhabitants are capable of bearing the charge and that a clause be inserted to that purpose into the bill for advancement of Trade.

Then came Mr. Secry Sewell from the upper house with the following message.

Upper House October 13rd 1683.

This house is ready to hear y^e Burgesses of Somerset Countye as to places appoynted for Townes in y^e Monnowke River.

Signed for me, Thos: Grunwin Etche.

Capt. Smith and Capt. Osborne goe to y^e Upper house according to the last message. The Committee for Advancement of Trade goe out.

Capt. Smith and Capt. Osborne returne and report to this house that the appoynting places for Townes de is affirmed by the bsp^o House to be the prerogative of y^e Lord Proprietary and that His Lord^o having appoynted the places for the townes in Somerset County the upper house say they can not alter y^e same.

Proposed by a Member of this house whether it be not necessary considering the Benefit and Conveniency of the Inhabitants of Am Anundell County that there be a place appoynted for a Towne in or near West and Roads Rivers in the County aforesaid.

In Answer whereunto is sent the following Message.

Upper House of Assembly October 13rd 1683

This house been offered by y^e Delegates of Am Anundell County in some convenient place of West or Roads Rivers all of y^e Inhabitants living between Rivers then y^e place appoynted in the said Delegates to offer the reasons to the upper house for their concurrence therein.

Capt. Hill and Mr. Richardson sent with y^e message.

They returne and say that the upper house seem to incline to the alteration of the place for a Towne in South River, but say they cannot resolve till His Lord^o commands.

The Committee for Advancement of Trade Report to this house a clause to be inserted into the act for advancement of Trade as followeth. And further least the great number of Townes, ports and places aforesaid may in time to come prove burthenome to y^e publick by increasing the
