

Number of Burgeses in each Assembly. Be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid That noe Towne, port or place, above mentioned shall at any time hereafter be enabled or made Capable of sending any Citizen or Citizens, Burges or Burges Delegates or Deputy to any Assembly hereafter to be convened or called until such time as the town or townes port or ports, place or places shall be actually inhabited by such and so many families as shall be sufficiently able and lyable to defray the Charge and Expences of such Delegate or Deputy who shall be elected and chosen by the freemen of each respective Towne or the Major part of them without being in any sort chargable or burthened to their respective Countys for or by reason thereof.

But that the Charge and Expences of such Citizens, Burgeses, Delegates and Deputyes shall from time to time and at all times hereafter be defrayed and borne by the respective Inhabitants of such town, port or place, for whom they or any of them shall serve as aforesaid. Saving to the Citizens of the Citye of St. Maloys all such Rights and Priviledges as have heretofore been granted to y<sup>m</sup> by His Lord<sup>t</sup> behalfe.

Put to ye question if the foregoing Clause ought to be added to the Bill for Advancement of Trade voted in the affirmative.

This house are of opinion that in the act for Townes a clause bee inserted that his Lord<sup>t</sup> of Lord<sup>r</sup> of Proprietary his Heirs and Successors. Lord<sup>r</sup> and Proprietaries of this Province have power reserved to him and them selves at any time hereafter to nominate and choose place or places where the jurisdiction in want of town or towns to be equally distributed with the towns mentioned in the said Act.
