This House notwithstanding desiring the dispatch of all matters before them have sent up the said Bill as it is to the Consideration of the upper House desiring likewise the assent of the Upper House to y^e Bill for Elections, having layne soe long in y^e Upper House since the Conference to which time this House is well assured to have given sufficient time for passing thereof.

Upper House October y^e 18th 1683

This House having seriously considered of the whole tyall of Jacob Young and of the untried Product of him, and all other Circumstances in relation to the same, are of opinion that the severall evidences & Accounts of him, are not sufficient in law to take away the life of y^e said Jacob Young, nor a Member of him. Yett doe believe, and Certifie hereby y^e by y^e severall Evidences and Circumstances thereunto belong there is sufficient to imprison y^e said Jacob during pleasure, and therefore desire the Conveniance of the Lower House in drawing upp a Bill of Attaynment ag^t him and that he may be imprisoned during the pleasure of his Loft and both houses of Assembly.
