

Jacob Young: It was put to the vote whether this House shall joyn with the Lower House in a bill of Attaynder as by the said Message is desired.  
Yea or Nay - Passed in the Negative.

Upon which vote was drawn the following Message: (viz)  
Lower House of Assembly October 18<sup>th</sup> 1683.  
This House cannot concur with the upper house in the Message sent this day to this house by Mr. Peter Darnall concerning a bill of Attaynder against Jacob Young. Signed of Orders, Eld Peter C. &c.

Capt. Smith, Major Long, Mr. Fisby, and Capt. Osborne sent with the foregoing Message, who returne and say they have delivered the same. Coll. Burgess and Coll. Stevens from the Upper House present to this house. A Bill Entitled an Act for the Manner of Electing Burgesses &c. as presented too by the upper house, and

A Bill for . . . . . concerning the breed of Horses &c. which was debated, and refused for further debate till to Morrow Morning.

Then was considered the bill for directing the Manner of Electing of Burgesses &c. which was read the first time.

The house adjournes till to Morrow Morning 7 a clock.

Friday October the Nineteenth 1683.

The house mett and Called, all present as Yesterday.

Then was read what was done Yesterday.

Then was taken into further debate the bill for Lessening of Number of Horses and bettering the breed thereof &c. and put to Judgment.

Then was read the bill Entitled an Act Directing the Manner of Electing and Summoning Burgesses Delegates and Representatives to serve in succeeding Assemblies the second time and taken into debate.

Whereupon this house Considered of severall Alterations and Amendments to be made in the said bill, such Alterations and Amendments to be drawn up: by the Committee for inspecting of Lanes according to Directions from this house received: who goe out.

Lower House of Assembly October 19<sup>th</sup> 1683.

This House have appointed Mr. Clement Hill, Mr. James Fisby and Mr. Richard Hall to joyn with Coll. William Stevens and Col. Miles Diggs (Members Nominated for a Committee to State and settle the publique Debts and accounts of this Province, who are now ready to goe out upon the same.
