

Evidences that has been examined w^{ch} him and all other circumstances relating to ye same, doe find these things following very clearly proved w^{ch} him w^{ch} said Jacob Young:

That in the year of our Lord 1677: when Coll^o Henry Coursey was imprisoned by a Commission from w^{ch} Hon^o Thomas (Notly Esq^r Deputy Governour of this Province, and the rest of the Councill to goe to fort Albany and to negotiate a peace with w^{ch} Northern Indians and w^{ch} his Majesty's Subjects of this Province and for w^{ch} Piscataway Indians at which time the said Coll^o Coursey, after his coming to fort Albany told w^{ch} S^r Jacob Young

to conclude a peace (if possible) for w^{ch} good of this Province and the Piscataway Indians, the said Jacob made answer before he came hither That the Susquehanna

would rather have given to come with him

proved by the oath of Coll^o Stevens

When Coll^o Coursey and Coll^o Stevens were sent

Indians, when the Northern Indians came and besieged

at which time, Jacob went as Interpreter, and w^{ch} S^r Jacob

by the S^r Jacob to aske the Northern Indians why they come down to warr with the Piscataway

Indians contrary to Articles of peace concluded with them in the year 1677: wherein the Piscataways were included. At which the said Jacob

said nothing for some time, but made answer that if he had thought

he should have spoke of any such thing to the Northern Indians, he would rather have given ten thousand pounds of Tobacco then have

come to interpret upon that account

proved by the said Coll^o Coursey and Coll^o Stevens. And since his imprisonment the said Jacob hath uttered these words,

That he had preserved Maryland twice, but have a care of the third time. proved by Edmund Dennis. And also uttered these words

That those that caused the Irons to be put upon his legs should pray daily for it when he was at liberty proved by the oath of John Higdon.

And moreover w^{ch} said Jacob spoke, that the said Susquehanna

were an innocent people, and that he could make them and w^{ch} said Northern Indians doe what he pleased proved by Joshua Domes

oath. All these matters foregoing proved by Christian Evidences, beside w^{ch} many things proved before Coll^o Coursey and Coll^o Loyds in their last

agency at fort Albany by the Indians. And wee his Majesty's Subjects being very sensible that for severall yeares past w^{ch} said Northern Indians

mixt with w^{ch} Susquehanos made Divers Incursions into this Province and committed many Robberys in it

And this House having seriously considered the great influence the said Jacob hath upon the said Susquehanna

and Lynego Indians and what a dangerous person, he is to this Government desire w^{ch} the Lower House will resume their Debate touching
