This House having taken into their serious Consideration the great Care and Kindness of our Sovereigne Lord, In giving Charge to the Right Reverend Father in God the Bishop of Canterbury to supply this Province with able and devout Ministers, whereby the people may know their Duty to God and their Obedience to their Ruler, doe request the Lower House of this Assembly to joyne with this House in giving thanks to Mr: Duell pread for his learned Sermon preached before those two houses the 14<sup>th</sup> And that youe acceptable Precent be given him for the same, and this House is willing to Concur with them therin.
