Then was read a bill Entitled an Act of Revises of the Testimony Lawes, the first time. Ordered that the Clerk transcribe the paper presented by Mr. Carville and Mr. Rousby and sign the same.

Coll: Darnall from the Upper house desires Mr. Rousby may have leave to goe to the Upper house about some businesse concerning the sayd Mr. Rousby. Mr. Speaker answers, that this house will send an answer to the sayd Mr. Rousby, hath leave of this house to goe up to the Upper house as desired. Then came Coll: Buzess to this house and presents two Bills - one for the Naturalization of Nicholas Verbraack, - and the other for Naturalizing of Andrew Poulson, atts Mullock - Peter Anson and Mathyas Peterstone, and their Children.

Then was Capt. Smith, Capt Osborne and Mr. Clement Hill sent to the Upper house with the Bill for advancement of trade, and one for Elections and the forementioned papers.
